

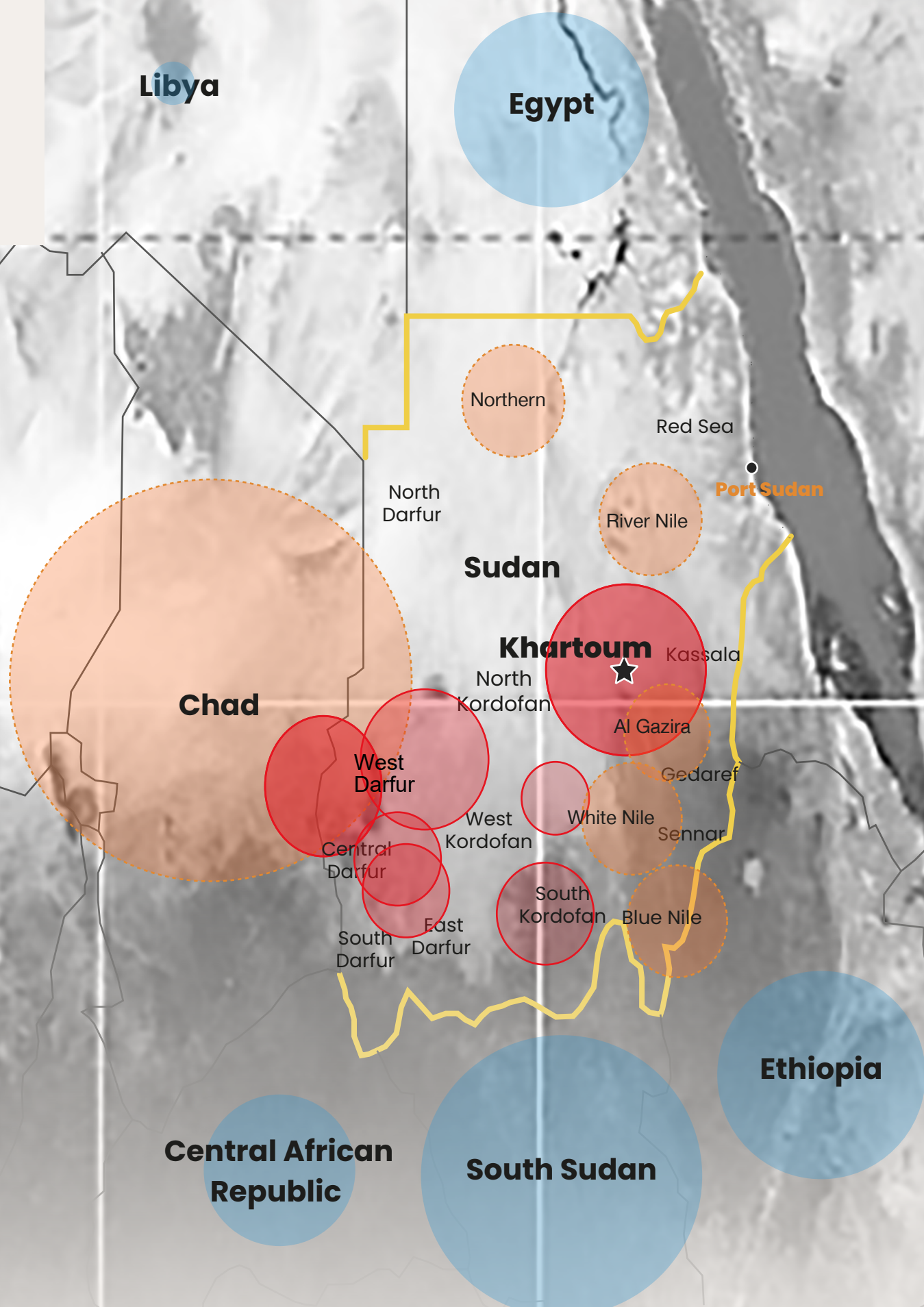
THE SUDAN CRISIS BY ZONE: A MAP TO GUIDE EFFECTIVE & TIMELY HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE

One way to improve the humanitarian response in Sudan is to use geographical zoning. This strategy helps to organize and adapt the response better, prevent inefficiencies and gaps, encourage cooperation and communication, match interventions to specific needs and challenges, and monitor and respond to changing situations on the ground.

The text describes four zones of different levels of humanitarian crisis & displacement.

- **Zone 1**
(The worst, where people suffer from violence and have no options to flee)
- **Zone 2**
(Is relatively stable, but still has problems)
- **Zone 3**
(Is critical, where people try to escape but face many dangers)
- **Zone 4**
(Is where people have left their homes and seek safety and opportunities elsewhere)
